MINUTES

Montevallo City Council Work Session August 9, 2021 5:30 p.m. at City Hall

Mayor Rusty Nix, Council Member David King, Council Member Lelia Mitchell, Council Member Kenneth Dukes, Council Member Sonya Swords, Member Martha Eisenberg were in attendance. Quorum present.

Work Session called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Mayor Rusty Nix.

Discussion of New Business Items:

Place request for bids for Storm Shelter #2 via Garver City Engineer, Matt Burgess.
Request to withdraw funds from Untied Bank Loan to pay Alabama Power Company construction of services for Strom Shelter #1.

Board Appointments: Mayor Nix announced the Board Appointment of Sherry Vallides to the Historical Preservation Commission with a term to expire 08.09.25.

Discussion of Other Business Items:

A submission of estimates from Officer Wilder for Lawn Care relating to property with overgrown weeds and lawn care for Council consideration. Mayor Nix advised another 30-day certified letter would need to be sent to the owner before any work could be done.

MDCD approved up to \$20,000 for the Orr Park Bridge repair with the expectation it would be completed prior to the Tinglewood Festival scheduled for September 11, 2021.

Mayor Nix requested to move to **Committee Reports**:

Council Member King called on Chief Littleton for the Police Department Report. Chief Littleton reported there were a Total of 105 Cases: 22 Traffic Accidents, 110 Traffic Citations, 33 Total Arrests, and 5 Thefts. Chief Littleton gave the Code Enforcement Report which had a Total of 11 Cases that were reported this period, 4 Inoperable Vehicles, 2 Miscellaneous, 5 Continuances, and a Total Number of Cases for the Year of 85. See Appendix 1.

Chief Davis gave the Fire Department Monthly Report, with 75 Calls 2nd half of July, 43 EMS Calls, 4 Lift Assists, 2 Structure Fires, 1 Brush Fire, 1 Electrical Fire, 0 Vehicle Fires, 13 Fire Alarms, 6 MVC, 5 Assist Other Agency, Total for July was 128. Chief Davis reported the Fire Prevention Division had a Total of 14 Fire Inspections and Reinspection. See Appendix 2.

Council Member King reported there is no update on Housing Abatement, and he reported the Planning and Zoning Commission would meet on August 19th at 6 p.m. in Council Chambers and that the meeting would be a Public Hearing.

Council Member Dukes reported on behalf of Kirk Hamby, Public Works Department (not present). Council Member Dukes reported the curbs have been painted on Oak, Valley and Middle Streets and the department has been working hard to keep Montevallo looking good. He also reported on the truck the department has been waiting on and advised it is scheduled to be built in 10 days and then delivered when completed.

Council Member Dukes called on Olivia Barone, Sustainability Coordinator. Olivia reported on the two grant applications the Council approved in July and advised if awarded both, the City would be able to leverage \$15,000 for a \$60,000 initial return. She reported on the 2020 ADECA SEP Grant that retrofitted lights in the library to LED. It is estimated an energy cost savings of \$10,000 annually. Olivia, Steve Gilbert City Clerk and Michelle Kyzer, Asst. City Clerk had a monitoring assessment review with ADECA in late July, and she received a letter advising their reporting was excellent. The Recycling Center weights from January to June 2021 was 102 tons which doubled from 2020. She reported on the ADEM 2020 Recycling Fund Grant which was awarded and that she's requested and received approval from ADEM for a budget amendment for recycling center equipment and give-a-ways. She reported at the next Council meeting she will be asking the Council to vote on five items. All expenditures requested will be over \$1,000. See Appendix 3.

Council Member Eisenberg advised there was no report from the Parks and Recreation Department.

Mayor Nix reported there is one more registration time for youth football on August 17th. He reported on park trails and advised the Park and Recreation Department is cutting the trails wider at Shoal Creek Park.

Mayor Nix called on Council Member Mitchell for reports on Education, Arts, and Outreach. Council Member Mitchell called on Sarah Hogan, Executive Director, Impact Montevallo. Sarah reported the Montevallo Junior City Council (MJCC) held their annual retreat today at the Library and they discussed potential projects, bylaw review, Roberts Rules of Order, and held Officer elections. She was happy to announce that Miss Olivia Gilbert will remain as your Junior Mayor. The MJCC will resume meeting in person every 1st and 3rd Monday in Council Chambers and invited the Council and public to attend. She also stated that Junior Mayor Gilbert will resume attending City Council meetings in person beginning at the next Council Meeting. Sarah reported the MJCC started working on a Fall Calendar of events. Impact discussed ways they could partner and work together to provide the best opportunities for our citizens. Sarah reported Impact is working on a Year 3 Action Plan and Budget that will begin on November 1st. This is our first continuation application process through the CDC. She has submitted Impact's potential budget to Steve Gilbert City Clerk and Michelle Kyzer Asst. City Clerk. Sarah reported

the Coalition discussed Community Connection Items and advised Impact will be utilizing the MHS Football games to distribute items and information from the ticket booth starting with the Vaping Ordinance to connect with as many youths and parents as possible. The first home game is August 20th. She asked if Council or others were interested in volunteering to help pass out information to let her know. She reported the Coalition discussed having neighborhood meetings to provide information and resources. There would be one meeting per district and asked Council for assistance in location and communication strategies. See Appendix 4.

Council Member Mitchell called on Savannah Kitchens, Library Director for the Library Report. Savannah reported 18,736 items checked out, 963 database searches, 1,276 Wi-Fi and Computer Sessions, 4 Virtual story times, 2 Dial-A-Story uploads, 3 Children's programs, 2 Teen programs, 2 Adult programs, 1,994 visits to the building, 398 program participation, 96 calls. Upcoming Events: COVID-19 Vaccine Q&A on August 10th at noon with a CRNP from Bibb Medical Center, Mini Music, Mr. Mac is back for Family Storytime. The Library has finished installing their new picture book shelving, purchased with grant funds, and authorized by the Library Board. See Appendix 5.

Meeting Call to Order – Mayor Rusty Nix called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM

Approval and/or corrections of the Minutes: 07.26.21 - Council Member Dukes made a motion to approve the Minutes as corrected, second Council Member Mitchell, All Ayes, Motion passed.

Recognitions / Awards: None

Mayor Nix called on Opportunities for citizens to speak to the Council:

Joyce Sherer 104 Tecumseh addressed Council about self-defense classes in our area. She asked Council if we had a shooting range or where she could go. Council Member King advised there is a public shooting range off Hwy. 17 and would get information to her on local ranges. Council Member King also recommended contacting the Shelby County Sheriff's Office about self-defense classes.

C.P. Pearson 1130 South Oak Street commented he had citizens contact him and said they could not hear the comments or reports from the council chambers microphone on Zoom and requested people to speak into the microphone.

Mayor Nix asked to resume **Committee Reports** and called on Council Member Mitchell to continue with her report.

Council Member Mitchell reported Montevallo School begins for students Thursday, August 12th A-J and Friday, August 13th K-Z and on Monday, 16th all students would be attending in person. Meet the Teachers will be held on Wednesday, August 11th with kindergartners at 8 a.m., 1st graders at 9 a.m., 2nd graders at 10 a.m., 3rd graders at 11 a.m., and 4th and 5th graders at 1 p.m. Council Member Swords advised it had changed and would be drive-through only to drop off school supplies / not in person. The University of Montevallo Bass Fishing Team was honored by Governor Kay Ivey on July 27th their Championship being #1 in the Country. Back to School Bash August 23rd, 4 p.m.-6 p.m. at Flower Hill. On Monday August 23rd full Fall Term classes begin at the University of Montevallo.

She reported The Boys and Girls Club is preparing for its after-school program when school begins.

Council Member Mitchell reported the American Village is offering free walking tours through the month of August and September, 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.

She reported the Education, Arts and Outreach Committee Meeting will be held on Wednesday, August 18th in Council Chambers at 6 p.m. and everyone is invited.

Mayor Nix called on Council Member Swords for reports on Finance, Economic Development & Tourism. Council Member Swords reported on behalf of Adele Nelson, Montevallo Chamber of Commerce as she was at the Farmers' Market. The Chamber participated in the University of Montevallo Preview Day and handed out Welcome Packets to over 50 potential UM students. This was the first time the Chamber had been invited to participate. The Chamber hosted two ribbon cuttings: Hair and Healing and Campus Village. She reported there are only two more Montevallo Farmers' Markets for the 2021 season. The Chamber is in the process of creating a new Montevallo Area Map which should be ready by the end of August. See Appendix 6.

Council Member Swords reported on behalf of Courtney Bennett, Executive Director, Montevallo Main Street. She reported Main Street commissioned a "Living Local" commercial with CBS 42 that will air for approximately 3 months, starting Labor Day Weekend. In addition to a general message of inviting people to visit our downtown businesses and enjoy our public art and parks, we are also promoting Tinglewood Festival on September 11 and Montevallo Art Stalk on October 23. This fits with our mission of promoting our downtown and encouraging commerce and tourism. She reported during UM's Welcome Weekend, Main Street will be

hosting an event for incoming UM students at the Art Studio on Saturday, August 21 from 3-6 PM. Council Member Swords reported the final Friday Nights at the Cove event of the summer was the best one of the series, with 185 attendees. She reported Main Street Alabama's annual conference will be held on August 18-20 in Gadsden. Currently 9 Main Street representatives plan to attend. If the mayor or any council members would like to join us at the conference for one day or all three days, please let her know. Main Street is still seeking submissions for its Youth Banner Project, ages 5-18.

Council Member Swords reported MDCD met today and the sidewalk project on Hwy 25 ais progressing. All MDCD paving and striping are complete. The construction of the restroom ats at Dailey Park has begun. She reported the Sims House project is not scheduled to bid until October. The kiosks at Shoal Creek Park are completed. Bridge repairs at the Golf Course are on hold for now. She reported they discussed repairs to the bridge at Orr Park and the MDCD allocated up to \$20,000 with Council approval for repairs of the walk bridge. No update on Main Street Tavern. Councilwoman Swords asked at the meeting if MDCD could set aside \$30,000 for schools for extracurricular activities and this being researched regarding the MDCD Charter for projects.

Public Health & Safety (Police, Fire, Code Enforcement, Housing Abatement, Planning and Zoning) – reported earlier during work session.

Sustainability (Streets & Sanitation, Recycling, Arbor & Beautification, ValloCycle, Environmental Preservation Initiatives, and Historical Commission) – reported earlier during work session.

Recreation, Preservation and Community Development (Parks & Recreation, Youth Athletics, Trails, Annexations) – reported earlier during work session.

Education, Arts & Outreach (Schools, Library UM, Boys & Girls Club, American Village, Sister City Commission, Artwalk, IMPACT) – Parnell Memorial Library, IMPACT, American Village, UM, and the Boys & Girls Club – reported earlier during work session and completed during regular Council Meeting.

Finance, Economic Development & Tourism (Finance, MDCD, IDB, Chamber, Main Street) – reported during regular Council Meeting.

Committee Reports and Consideration of Bills:

Council Member King made a motion to pay the bills, second by Council Member Dukes, All Ayes. Motion passed.

New Business: Recommendation to allow Garver, USA (City Engineer Mathew Burgess) to advertise open bids, and administer the process for such bids, for the purpose of constructing a Tornado Shelter on property located behind Fire Station Number 1. Motion made by Council Member King to accept the request, second by Council Member Dukes, All Ayes, Motion Passed.

Request to withdraw funds in the amount of \$4,306.53 from the United Bank Loan for the purpose of power line construction to Stephens Park Storm Shelter. Motion made by Council Member King, second by Council Member Mitchell, All Ayes, Motion Passed.

Old Business: None

Board Appointments: Sherry Vallides to Historical Preservation Commission term to expire 08.09.25. Motion to accept Board Appointment made by Council Member King, second by Council Member Eisenberg, All Ayes, Motion Passed.

Other Business: Office Wilder submitted Job Estimate bids for 110 Samford Street. Mayor Nix reported the low bid is \$150 from Lawn Care to abate weeds. Motion to accept bid of \$150 from Lawn Care by Council Member King, second by Council Member Eisenberg, All Ayes, Motion Passed. Appendix 8.

Request from MDCD to allocate up to \$20,000 of MDCD City Funds for the Orr Park Walk Bridge to be repaired. Motion made by Councilman King, second made by Councilwoman Swords, All Ayes, Motion Passed.

There being no further business before the Council, Mayor Rusty Nix called for a Motion to Adjourn. Motion to adjourn made by Council Member Mitchell, second by Council Member Swords. Meeting Adjourned at 6:19 p.m.

2. 2020 ADECA SEP Grant

- a. This grant was to retrofit lights in library to LED and small portion
 - i. Estimated kWh savings over 60,000 and cost savings of \$10,000 annually
 - ii. May, June, and July 2021 usage averages down 3,026 kwh or \$495.54 a month.
- b. Steve, and Michelle, and I had a monitoring assessment review in late July.
 - 1. Received a letter saying all our reporting was excellent.
- ii. Submitted final invoices, and final report is due August 31st
- 3. Recycling Center weights from January to June 2021:
 - a. 102 tons (204,000 pounds)
 - i. Doubled our recycling rates from 2020. The single stream system has removed most barriers to recycling before.
 - b. 11,257 pounds in donations to ATS
 - c. 5,162 pounds in electronics recycling
- 4. ADEM 2020 Recycling Fund Grant
 - a. We applied for this in February 2020 and were awarded in October 2020. Things have changed significantly at the Recycling Center since applying for the grant. In addition to a general message of inviting folks to visit our downtown businesses and enjoy our public art and parks, we are also promoting Tinglewood Festival on September 11 and Montevallo Art Stalk on October 23.
