

Prentice High School

This was the site of Prentice High School, established in 1950 to meet the need for a Black high school in Montevallo. Previously, students of color had to travel eighteen miles to Columbiana for secondary education. The school was built on land purchased from Hampton D. Lee and Exie Patric Lee and completed in March 1950. Originally called Montevallo Negro High School, it took its name from Rev. Joseph S. Prentice, a prominent church leader from nearby Aldrich. Prentice High School quickly became a hub of academic and social activity, adopting green and gold colors and a dragon mascot. Under the leadership of George Dailey, among others, the school provided a full high school experience until desegregation led to its closure in 1970. Dailey, Prentice's final principal, was Montevallo's first African American City Council member and is honored at George Dailey Park, located in front of what is now Montevallo Middle School. This marker serves as a reminder of the legacy of a beloved school that made a lasting contribution to Black education in central Alabama.

Executive Summary

The network infrastructure at Montevallo City Hall is now critically out of date with multiple devices at or near EOL with associated expired cybersecurity protection licenses. In addition, the network has multiple bottle necks in the existing equipment and wiring resulting in very poor performance. As with many facilities that have had multiple owners over the years, previous IT providers have evidently addressed specific, point issues without looking at the ramifications to the overall network design. The results are a network that has many bottle necks throughout the network severely limiting the bandwidth available to most workstations and devices. See my original "Montevallo Network Cost & Bandwidth Bottle Necks" Figure below. Since this diagram was created, the firewall (and both main switches) used have also gone EOL and associated cybersecurity protection licensing for the firewall has expired.

Specifics to be addressed:

- Current firewall is within a few months of EOL AND requires costly updated licenses that would immediately need to be replaced as well. We will be providing a new Firewall supporting the latest cybersecurity protections, a higher bandwidth and support for other capabilities (described separately below).
- 2. Current switches are ALL EOL, do not provide enough ports to support the connections wired and needed within the building AND do not support current data rates (most ports are still limited to 100mb!) resulting in poor network throughput and delayed operations for every user. We will be installing several new switches supporting the latest network bandwidths and providing sufficient port connections for the building. NOTE: We will offer an option to continue to use the out of date, EOL 48 port PoE switch for non-critical Surveillance Cameras to save money but isolated to its own VLAN through the connection to the new Firewall and Switches that support this.
- 3. Network connections from the main IT Closet to the Court Room IT closet are via WiFi to WiFi only with no wire. The signals are then converted back to ethernet and used to support multiple connections in the

Part III. 1GbE vs 2.5GbE vs 10GbE, what's the difference?

√1GbE

Gigabit Ethernet is a version of the Ethernet technology broadly used in local area networks (LANs) for transmitting Ethernet frames at 1 Gbps. It's used to describe various technologies for transmitting Ethernet frames at a rate of gigabits per second, as defined by the IEEE 802.3-2005 standard. The standard allows for half-duplex gigabit connections via hub connections, but the speeds achieved on the market with full-duplex connections using switches are truly standard. Gigabit Ethernet is a technology built on top of the underlying Ethernet standard.

√ 10GbE

10 Gigabit Ethernet (10 GbE) is a telecommunication technology that offers data speeds up to 10 billion bits per second. It's originally adopted in 2002 as IEEE Std 802.3ae-2002. 10GE also retains the Ethernet minimum and maximum frame length specified in the 802.3 standard. This enables users to communicate with lower-speed Ethernets conveniently when upgrading their existing Ethernets. Due to the high data rate, 10GE no longer uses copper wire but only uses optical fiber as the transmission medium. It uses long-distance optical transceivers and single-mode fiber interfaces to work in wide area networks and metropolitan area networks. 10GE can also use cheaper multimode fiber, but the transmission distance is 65~300m.

√ 2.5GbE

The market for 2.5GbE is enlarging and more and more 2.5GbE switches and routers are producing and selling. Therefore, compared with 10GbE, the cost of 2.5GbE devices and deployment is significantly lower. One of the factors that accelerates the development of 2.5GbE is WiFi 6 which enables wireless connection to over 1GbE LAN. The latest enterprise level WiFi 6 solutions include 2.5GbE ports or even 10GbE ports. In addition, upgrading to 2.5GbE is worthy especially for small enterprises because of its availability and cost-efficiency. There is no need for rewiring and the current CAT5e can be used in your present Ethernet connection.
