Montevallo City Council Work Session

July 8, 2024

5:30 p.m. at City Hall

Present: Mayor Rusty Nix, Council Member Lelia Mitchell, Council Member Kenneth Dukes, Council Member Martha Eisenberg. Absent: Council Member David King, Council Member Sonya Swords. Quorum present.

Work Session Call to Order at 5:30 P.M. by Mayor Nix with Quorum present.

Mayor Nix advised there is no New Business for discussion.

Mayor Nix advised there is no Old Business for discussion.

Mayor Nix Called for Committee Reports:

Mayor Nix called on Chief Davis for the Fire Department Report. Chief Davis reported there were 155 Total Calls for the month of June. See Appendix 1.

Mayor Nix called on Chief Littleton for the Police Report. Chief Littleton reported there were 102 Total Reports for the Month; he also reported the 4th of July went smooth without issue; he addressed the Mayor and City Council regarding the flock cameras and how they have assisted in solving cases and thanked them once again for the cameras. Mayor Nix called on Council Member Dukes for the Sustainability Report. Council Member Dukes called on Kirk Hamby, Head of Public Works. Kirk read a letter from the Alabama Historical Commission reporting that the Montevallo City Cemetery is now listed in the Alabama Historic Cemetery Register. See Appendix 3.

Mayor Nix called on Council Member Eisenberg for Recreation, Preservation and Community Development Reports. Council Member Eisenberg read a report from Shane Baugh, Parks and Recreation Director. Council Member Eisenberg reported they will be hosting The American Legion State Baseball Tournament Friday and Saturday; a pickleball tournament will be held at Stephen's Park this weekend; Flag Football begins in August; supplies to resurfacing the tennis courts have been ordered and should arrive this week. See Appendix 4.

Mayor Nix called on Council Member Mitchell for the Education, Arts & Outreach Reports. Council Member Mitchell called on Mariss Wilson, Director of the Parnell Memorial Library. Marissa reported 2,372 people that participated in the programs at the library during the month of June; there were 5,500 visitors in June; are 47 programs currently running at the library. See Appendix 5.

Council Member Mitchell called on Sarah Hogan, Program Director, Impact Montevallo. Sarah reported 22 students participated in Camp Journey; K.A.S.H. (Kids Action: Side Hustle) Market was a great success; MAC Cook-Off will be held on July 27th and Impact will be participating; Impact is sending both SROs to the National School Safety Conference in Phoenix and once completed our SROs will have the highest status possible for an SRO – National SRO Practitioner status. Council Member Mitchell called on Montevallo Junior City Council Junior Mayor Mary Elizabeth House for the Montevallo Junior City Council Report (MJCC) Report. Junior Mayor Mary Elizabeth reported the MJCC is seeking additional members for students 8th grade and up; the MJCC is in the process of planning activities.

Council Member Mitchell reported the University of Montevallo Summer II Term begins today.

Mayor Nix called for Finance, Economic Development & Tourism. Mayor Nix advised Adele, Executive Director, Montevallo Chamber of Commerce is at the Farmers' Market. A report was submitted and is in Council packets; the Chamber Luncheon will be on July 17th featuring Montevallo Past and Present; the Montevallo Map Project should be completed by late August.
