Montevallo City Council Work Session June 23, 2025 5:30 p.m. at City Hall

Present: Mayor Rusty Nix, Council Member David King, Council Member Lelia Mitchell, Council Member Kenneth Dukes, Council Member Sonya Swords, Council Member Martha Eisenberg. Quorum present.

Work Session Called to Order at 5:30 P.M. by Mayor Nix with Quorum present.

Discussion of New Business Items:

- **Discussion of Resolution 06232025-867** A Resolution Authorizing the Appointment of the City Clerk to provide the Voter List for the Municipal Election to be held on August 26, 2025.
- Discussion of Request to accept the Bid of Central Alabama Asphalt and Construction Company, LLC in the amount of \$219,868.41 for Paving Contract of 2025 City Wide – Resurfacing. Funds from Alabama Gas Tax Revenues. (Lowest Qualified Bidder)

Mayor Nix Called for Committee Reports:

Mayor Nix called on Council Member King for Public Health and Safety Reports. Council Member King called on Chief Littleton for the Police Department Report. Chief Littleton reported there were 45 Reports for June and 469 Total Cases for the Year. See Appendix 1.

Council Member King called on Chief Davis for the Fire Department report. Chief Davis reported the Total Calls for the first half of June was 66. See Appendix 2.

Council Member King reported the Planning and Zoning Meeting had three requests and those will come to City Council in July.

Mayor Nix called on Council Member Dukes for the Sustainability Reports. Council Member Dukes called on Kirk Hamby, Head of Public Works. Kirk reported the trees down in Orr Park have been cleaned up by crews today; crews are working to catch up on right of way cutting; leaf and grass vacuum has been delivered, operational, and tested; archeological digs in Shoal Creek Park is going on this week.

Mayor Nix called for Recreation, Preservation and Community Development. Sydney Aguilar, Director Youth Sports reported Flag Football, Football, and Cheerleading is open online until August 1st; Travel Ball will continue another two weeks. See Appendix 3.

Mayor Nix called on Council Member Mitchell for the Education, Arts & Outreach Reports. Council Member Mitchell called on Marissa Wilson, Director Parnell Memorial Library. Marissa reported Summer reading is going great; Parnell Memorial Library won Best of the Best for Shelby County for the Library and for Best Community Center; she thanked the Montevallo Arts Collaborative for donating the Summer reading themed art books; there is something happening at the Library for all ages and interests during the month of July. Mayor Nix called for Committee Reports to Continue:

Council Member Mitchell called on Mary Elizabeth House, Montevallo Junior City Council (MJCC) Junior Mayor for the MJCC Report: Mary Elizabeth reported MJCC participated at Juneteenth; she reported the MJCC will be hosting a Candidate Forum for City Elections and will inform everyone of the date once set.

Council Member Mitchell read a written report submitted by Sarah Hogan Shaw, Program Director Impact Montevallo. Sarah was at Montevallo Farmers' Market at the K.A.S.H. Market for youth and could not attend Council; Impact has participated all week with Camp Journey, which had the largest youth group with 32 rising 6th graders participating. See Appendix 5.

Council Member Mitchell reported the American Village will be celebrating America's 249th birthday and is hosting its annual July 4th celebration and the public is invited; the American Village is offering VIP Passes for the event for \$150 which includes early entrance, swag bag, private VIP area, front seating, swag bag, and more. Council Member Mitchell read a report from the Montevallo Sister City Commission submitted by President Cindy Boyd. The Montevallo Sister City is asking for funds to support the student exchange program which has six students traveling to Echizen, Japan, July 5th through July 14th and all the students are from the City of Montevallo. There is a Jail & Bail event being held on June 27th at Medders Family Farm from 3:30 PM – 7:30 PM. All funds raised will go towards airfare and are 100% deductible. See Appendix 6.

Council Member Mitchell read a report submitted by the Montevallo Boys and Girls Club; they have 125 youth signed up for the summer program and are at maximum capacity summer shirts were sponsored by the Montevallo Rotary Club, Montevallo Chamber of Commerce, and IMPACT Montevallo; they take the youth swimming once per week at the University of Montevallo; they went to the Birmingham Zoo which was sponsored by the Shelby County Commission; Abner, a therapy dog, will be visiting this week; this week they will be taking the 10-17 year olds to Marquee Oasis for a field trip. Mayor Nix called on Council Member Swords for Finance, Economic Development & Tourism. Council Member Swords she received a written report from Courtney Bennett, Director Montevallo Main Street. A Resolution Authorizing the Appointment of the City Clerk to Provide the Voter List for the Municipal Election to be held on August 26, 2025

WHEREAS, the City Council of Montevallo, Alabama has been informed that Russell "Rusty" Nix has qualified as a candidate for the office of Mayor and is seeking re-election; and,

WHEREAS, the Code of Alabama 1975 Section 11-46-37 provides that if the Mayor is a candidate for re-election, the Mayor is disqualified from the duty of providing the list of qualified electors; and,

WHEREAS, the Code of Alabama 1975 Section 11-46-37 further provides that the Council is required to appoint a person to perform this duty; and,

WHEREAS, the Code of Alabama 1975 Section 11-46-36(a) provides that the list of electors must be filed on or before the third Tuesday in July prior to the general municipal election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEVALLO, ALABAMA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Council hereby appoints Steve Gilbert, City Clerk, to provide the list of qualified electors for the general Municipal Election to be held on August 26, 2025.

Section 2. That the City Clerk is required to publish on or before the third Tuesday in July preceding the general Municipal Election, the list of qualified electors in each District of the City of Montevallo, to be listed alphabetically in each District, Places 1 (one) thru 5 (five).

Section 3. That the list of qualified electors shall be posted in no less than 3 (three) public places within the City of Montevallo, Alabama.

Section 4. Furthermore, that the City Clerk shall post the list of qualified electors 5 days prior to the election, in no less than 3 public places within the City of Montevallo, Alabama. (This list shall contain the added names of qualified electors meeting the 30 day residency requirement within their voting District.)
