# Mayor Nix Called for Committee Reports:

Mayor Nix called on Council Member King for Public Health and Safety Reports. Council Member King called on Chief Littleton for the Police Department Report. Chief Littleton reported there were 52 Reports for May and 424 Total Cases for the Year. See Appendix 1.

Council Member King called on Chief Davis for the Fire Department report. Chief Davis reported the Total Calls for May was 136 and 635 Total Calls for the Year. See Appendix 2.

Council Member King reported there would be a Planning and Zoning Meeting on June 19<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 PM in Council Chamber and it is open to the public.

Mayor Nix called on Council Member Dukes for the Sustainability Reports. Council Member Dukes called on Kirk Hamby, Head of Public Works. Kirk reported there was a tree down on power lines and once the power company had repaired the power line our crews had an excellent response time to clear roads of tree and debris.

Council Member Dukes reminded everyone there will be a Juneteenth Celebration on June 19<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 AM – 1:00 PM at George Dailey Park and invited everyone to attend.

Mayor Nix called for Recreation, Preservation and Community Development. Sydney Aguilar, Director Youth Sports reported in-person Cheer and Football registration will be held Tuesday; Football conditioning starts this month; Travel Ball is still taking place each weekend. See Appendix 3.

Mayor Nix called on Council Member Mitchell for the Education, Arts & Outreach Reports. Council Member Mitchell called on Marissa Wilson, Director Parnell Memorial Library. She reported there were 36 programs running in May with 633 program participation; 77 community meetings; 3,027 WiFi and

computer sessions; 3, 113 visits to the building 657 database searches; Summer reading is in full force and the theme is Color our World-ART; Summer Reading kickoff was a huge event; Summer reading events and calendar are up; Parnell Memorial Library will be at the Juneteenth Celebration the library has received three grants: \$5,500 LSTA, \$3,000 from Russell Bedsole, \$10,000 to add some sensory panels to their Pecan Grove. See Appendix 4.

Council Member Mitchell called on Sarah Hogan Shaw, Program Director Impact Montevallo. Sarah reported The Annual Safe Schools Conference was very informative and she has a dozen pages of notes to share; IMPACT will be participating at Juneteenth, Camp Journey, and the Chamber's Community Awards event; she is partnering with a number of community organizations – Parnell Memorial Library, Boys & Girls Club, Montevallo Children's Theatre, Montevallo Middle School, and Sister City Commission; she is working with the SROs to prepare an informational brochure to share with local businesses about the new laws enacted: Laughing Gas; Vaping; THC/Cannabinoid Products. Council Member Mitchell called on Mary Elizabeth House, Montevallo Junior City Council (MJCC) Junior Mayor for the MJCC Report: Mary Elizabeth reported the Olivia Gilbert has completed the commemorative video and it will be uploaded to the MJCC website soon; MJCC will be participating at the Juneteenth Celebration making sno-cones; she reported there are a lot of summer camps for youth to participate in such as volleyball, basketball; Summer school is in its second week; the principal is working with the University of Montevallo to try and work out having basketball and volleyball games for the upcoming year; soccer youth camp was last week and had a very good turnout; Cross-Country Fun Run was held this past Saturday at Shoal Creek Park and she thanked the City for their support; she had the honor of representing Montevallo High School at Alabama's Girl State and it was a great experience.

Council Member Mitchell reported the University of Montevallo, and the American Village will be closed for the Juneteenth Holiday; and mark your calendar for June 14<sup>th</sup> and plan to visit the American Village to celebrate the Army's 250<sup>th</sup> birthday celebration and a Flag Celebration; the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Juneteenth Celebration, hosted by the Montevallo Parks and Recreation Board, will be held Thursday, June 19<sup>th</sup> at George Dailey Park from 10:30 AM until 1:30 PM and invited everyone to attend.



Yes, there is a way to put a black border/outline on the letters if we print the job. BUT, I planned to use a vinyl with a longevity so you don't need to update the sign very often. This vinyl would not allow a black outline.



### ORDINANCE NO. 06092025-829

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MONTEVALLO, ALABAMA, TO EXEMPT CERTAIN "COVERED ITEMS" FROM THE MUNICIPAL SALES AND USE TAX DURING THE THIRD FULL WEEKEND OF JULY 18, 2025, AS AUTHORIZED BY ACT 2017-120, GENERALLY REFERRED TO AS THE STATE SALES TAX HOLIDAY LEGISLATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MONTEVALLO, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. In conformity with the provisions Act 2017-120 enacted by the Alabama Legislature during the 2017 Regular Session, providing for a State Sales Tax Holiday, the City of MONTEVALLO, Alabama, exempts "covered items" (see attached Exhibit A) from municipal sales and use tax during the same period, beginning at 12:01 a.m. on the third Friday in July (July 18, 2025) and ending at twelve midnight the following Sunday (July 20, 2025).

Section 2. This ordinance shall be subject to all terms, conditions, definitions, time periods, and rules as provided by Act 2017-120.

Section 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this ordinance under the seal of the City of MONTEVALLO. Alabama, and to forward said certified copy to the Alabama Department of Revenue to be recorded and posted on the Department website.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective upon publication.
