Committee Chair, Julie Smitherman, reported that designs for the new Black History Month banner series have been drafted and will be considered by City Council next Monday; as a reminder, this new banner series was created from local children's art and the printing of the banners will be equally split between Main Street, Impact Montevallo, and Montevallo Legacy Project; Shane has tested out the Promenade Lighting Project and a work day, ideally with support of Public Works, will be scheduled in August before the fall semester begins; the Monte Gras Ball Planning Committee continues to meet, and 2026 ticket and sponsorship prices have been determined; John has installed our watermelon disc at the photo frame, and all are encouraged to send him photos we take at the frame to thank him for his work on this project; plans are being made to replace the three dead roses at the Post Office.

Promotion Committee:

In the absence of Committee Chair, Sarah Hogan Shaw, Courtney Bennett reported that the June Friday Nights at the Cove featured a beautiful display in honor of our 9 year anniversary of being a Designated Main Street Community, as well as a duck hunt, before rain caused us to cancel 45 minutes into the event; the UM Orientation Week Craft Party has been set for August 17 at Parnell Library; and sponsorships are now being solicited for the 2025 Dia de Muertos/Day of the Dead Festival.
